LOCATION

Located in Northeast Ohio, roughly 50 miles southeast of Cleveland and 15 miles northwest of Youngstown, the City of Warren occupies a land area of approximately 16 square miles and serves a population of over 46,000 residents.

- Centrally located between Cleveland and Pittsburgh, New York City and Chicago.
- Easily accessible via interstate highways 76 and 80, US highway 422, and state highways 5, 11, 45, and 82.

QUALITY OF LIFE

The City of Warren offers a climate in which residents enjoy all four seasons, from dewy springs to warm summers, gloriously colorful autumns and bracing winters.

- Average January minimum: 15°F
- Average July maximum: 83°F

Warren City Schools offer a quality education to a diverse group of dedicated and engaged students. New educational facilities are currently being constructed, with completion expected in 2009.

The city is home to two comprehensive and award winning hospitals: Trumbull Memorial (Forum Health) and St. Joseph's (Humility of Mary Health Partners).

Several performing arts venues are located in the city, including the Packard Music Hall and Warren Community Amphitheatre, both of which offer free and ticketed arts performances. Other local cultural attractions include Warren's Philharmonic Orchestra, the Trumbull Art Gallery and a variety of local fairs and festivals held throughout the summer.

ECONOMIC PROFILE

The city works closely with private industry and federal, state, and regional agencies to continually improve economic conditions in our community; creating, retaining, and expanding job opportunities for residents. A full-range of incentives are offered to existing and relocating firms, from low-interest small business loans to tax abatements.

Major employers include General Motors, Delphi Packard Electric Systems, Youngstown Air Reserve Base (910th), AVI Foodsystems, and WCI Steel.

The City of Warren maintains a bond rating of AAA, according to industry standards (Standard & Poor's).
